

Things to talk about at home...



Jigsaw content

The children have settled back into school life with excitement and eagerness to meet their new Jigsaw Jiggie and begin the Jigsaw curriculum tailored to their year group. PSHE-Jigsaw is a mindful approach that delivers weekly sessions from F1 - Nursery to Year 6. It will cover different aspects within PSHE learning and Social and Emotional development. The curriculum ensures that learning from previous years is revisited and extended, adding new concepts, knowledge and skills, year on year as appropriate.

This half term's Jigsaw piece is Being Me In My World. This piece covers a wide range of topics, including a sense of belonging, welcoming others and being part of a school community, a wider community, and a global community; it also looks at children's rights and responsibilities, working and socialising with others, and pupil voice.
