Holidays in term time

Holidays in term time can not be approved.

We want to remind all parents of the new attendance legislation from the Department for Education (DFE) that came into effect from August 2024 regarding term time holidays and unauthorised absences in school.

The fine for term-time holidays will be issued per parent, per child of £80 (if paid within 21 days) or £160 (if paid within 28 days) If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. If a parent receives two fines in a 3 year period, prosecution will be considered, resulting in a fine of up to £2,500. If your child's attendance is below 90% and they are absent from school for five days or more then prosecution will be as above.

Mobile Phones

A reminder for you that as part of our Safeguarding responsibilities and in line with our school behaviour policy, the following procedures regarding mobile phones are in place:

- As a general rule, children should not bring mobile phones into school. However, if your child is in Year 5 and 6 and is walking to and from school alone we do allow them to bring in phones as long as we have received written parental permission.
- Mobile phones must be switched off when pupils are on the school grounds.
- Mobile phones must be handed into the class teacher at the start of the school day.
- Mobile phones must not be switched back on until your child leaves the school premises
